On and off-sometimes, occasionally, not continuously

On the ball-quick to understand

On the same wavelength-when two people agree on most things, they are on the same wavelength

On the tip of the tongue-the inability to remember a word

On the warpath-very angry

Over the odds-more than it's worth

Panacea-something that people think will make everything better

Plain sailing-easy to do or achieve

Play your cards right-do the right thing

Postpone/delay-put off

Pros and cons-advantages and disadvantages

Put you in the picture-to explain something to someone

Quid pro quo-something that you give or do in exchange for something else

Speak off the cuff-without preparing ahead of time what one will say, without preparation

Stick to your guns-maintain your point of view

Talk to a brick wall-talk to an unresponsive person

Talking at cross purposes-if two people talk at cross purposes, they do not understand each other because they talk about different things

To talk shop-to discuss one's business or profession

Tongue-tied-unable to speak
